CREATIVE TEAM

ORIGINAL IDEA AND DIRECTION

SABRINA BARAN

Artistic director of L'Illusion, Sabrina trained in puppet theater and creation for young audiences with artists from Quebec and Europe. She is involved in the creation, development and performance of the company's shows, including Chantefable, À la belle étoile and Philémon et Baucis. In 2012, she created Ondin, her first show, followed by Tommelise (2017) and Conte du Littoral (2018). These shows have been presented in Quebec, Canada and internationally.

LOUIS-CHARLES SYLVESTRE

Louis-Charles is a long-time collaborator with L'Illusion. He was a performer in Histoire à dormir debout and Conte du Littoral, for which he also wrote the text. He has extensive experience in writing for young audiences, both for theater (Chico et la montagne, Polo le voyage de l'autre côté, La chasse aux cookies) and television (Les Sapiens, Les Mutants, Nicolas Noël). Since 2020, he teaches at the National Theatre School of Canada (French section).


MARION DAIGLE

Since 2005, Nicolas has played guitar in a number of jazz projects (Les Associés, Ad Astra Quartet, Andy King Group, Guillaume Martineau's quintet and the Nicolas Ferron Trio). In 2013, Nicolas formed the duo Les Passagers with Andréanne Muzzo, a group combining world music, jazz, electronica and psychedelic rock. Thanks to his collaboration with the McGill Jazz Orchestra, he has had the opportunity to share the stage with major names on the international jazz scene. Nicolas has also worked with theatrical music in productions such as *Conte du littoral*.

PUPPET AND SET DESIGN

LAURENCE GAGNON LEFEBVRE

Laurence Gagnon graduated from the set-design section of National Theatre School of Canada in 2011. Ever since, she has been designing spaces for poetic and socially-committed events. Her passion for raw materials has also shaped the development of simple and timeless worlds. Her spaces and characters are suited to every one's imagination. They are always collectively developed as part of an open and genuine process. Through set designing, she is trying to nurture the writing and outline what words cannot convey.

PUPPET AND COSTUME DESIGN

SOPHIE DESLAURIERS

Sophie Deslauriers learned sculpting with synthetic materials, casting techniques and resins during her training. She worked for a year with set designer Natacha Belova in Brussels before working with Théâtre aux Mains nues company in Paris, France. In Quebec, she wrote a creative thesis at UQAM university on the adaptation and staging of Maus, a graphic novel by Art Spiegelman. She designs and creates puppets for various companies by working with them on their set designs.

RENAUD PETTIGREW

Navigating between theater, dance, comedy, opera and pop music, Renaud Pettigrew, graduated from the National Theatre School of Canada in 2008, has over 100 designs to his credit. His work has been acclaimed both in Canada and internationally. Inspired by his surroundings, his creative approach helps to orient the viewer's gaze, to create enveloping atmospheres and to shape the space by highlighting its unique character.



ABOUT THE SHOW

Glimmers is an invitation to imagine what is not yet here, to conjure up the possibilities, the impossibilities, to allow ourselves to be imbued by all that surrounds us, and to start anew from what seems is over so that, slowly, life emerges.

In this new creation by L'Illusion, two pupeteers unfold a new world to the beat of a mesmerizing rythm. Light surges and illuminates the meanderings of untrodden paths teeming with creatures the likes of which we've never seen....yet.
